All About Charlie by Patti Lee Bock

Last fall Jill asked Perry and me if we would try and socialize a cat that had been surrendered to the shelter when an older lady passed away leaving 3 cats running around her farm. When the attorney who was in charge of her estate went out to the farm, he caught the cats with a live trap. One of these cats was Charlie. He had an injured eye that had to be removed, was neutered and then was brought to the shelter. Charlie lived in a rooming room with about 15 other cats. When we first went to visit him, Perry had to wear a heavy coat and work gloves to catch him. He would fight and try to run away and hide. He was quick but Perry was quicker, but could be held for only a short time. He would tremble and hide his head in our arms. He would rip up our shirts and scratch our arms trying to get away. But we went there every day and just held him. He soon started to like it when we came. He started coming to us willingly and we could hold him with just one arm. His fur and nails went from brittle to soft and he liked being combed. He would sleep in our arms, snoring and drooling in peace. He doesn't like Burger King or whipped cream. He has made cat friends and he would eat in front of the other volunteers. He doesn't purr, hiss, or play with toys. He is an older cat around 8 years old and our wishes came true when he was adopted in December along with Jelly. He loves his new home and has found comfort under the dresser and in the bathroom sink. His owner puts towels in the bathroom sink so he is comfortable and they wash their hands in the bathtub. What a lucky boy he is!

In October 2009, Lenore Pearson was driving in town and spotted a kitten, which appeared to be injured. She stopped to check on it and saw that it was injured. She checked around the area, but couldn't find the owner, so she took the kitten to the Vet Clinic and helped pay his bill. Help is needed at the shelter

We can always use more help with our cats and dogs. If you are available to help out, even one time slot a week would be helpful, please call the shelter voice mail and leave a message. We are looking for volunteers to be 18 years of age or older.

We could also use a hand on Saturdays from 11-2 with help doing adoptions when our shelter is open to the public. Or if you could provide foster care, from time to time, we could use more homes. We sometimes get little kittens needing to be bottle fed until old enough to eat on their own, or dogs that may have a hard time getting comfortable at the shelter. We would supply food, litter, etc. Please call our voice mail 359-2312.

DRIVER NEEDED. The Brown County Humane Society is now in charge of picking up the stray and abandoned animals in Brown County. Butch Freidenich and his wife, Jean, have been doing the majority of this for us for the past 2 years. Due to health problems, Butch can no longer do this work. It's not a daily or weekly task, but we do need someone that can be available on short notice to pick up the animals and transport them to the vet clinic to be checked.

Want to help? Here's how!

We will be collecting car batteries for recycling. Please drop off your old batteries in a receptacle at the shelter - 1301 South Valley Street. Dick Johnson will pick them up and take them to Mankato, where we will get \$1.30 a piece for them.

We recycle used books, cds, dvds, and cell phones. Drop off at the shelter or Pampered Pets.

Donations - We are saving Kemp's caps and Milk Mocha from Kwik Trip Beverages. Drop off points are at the Humane Society shelter, Pampered Pets and New Ulm Vet Clinic - right inside their first set of doors. Thank you Jean Freidenich and Patti Lee Book for collecting them for us. We are also collecting empty ink cartridges. Drop off points are same as listed above. Please put them in a ziplock or plastic bag.

Collecting aluminum cans - donations can be dropped off at the shelter in the big trailer and collection bin, and also at Kwik Trip, behind their boarded area is a collection bin. Thanks to Dan and Deb Alstebon and Jean Freidenich for volunteering to collect the cans.

Hy-Vee Shoppers, save the UPC Labels (Barcode) from Hy-Vee brand, Hy-Vee Grand Selection, Hy-Vee Health Market & Midwest Country Fare. We can get \$.05 for each label. Drop offs at New Ulm Vet Clinic, Pampered Pets and the shelter or mail them to BCCHS - PO Box 512, New Ulm.

Save the redemption square from GLAZERS (glazed donuts) at Kwik Trip & drop off at the Shelter.
